HLTHIR501A	<p><b>Maintain An Effective Health Work Environment</b></p> <p>Describes the skills and knowledge required to work maintain an effective work environment in a health setting by monitoring, coordinating and promoting the implementation of ethical, safe and effective work practices in line with established work requirements.</p>
HLTCOM404B	<p><b>Communicate Effectively With Clients</b></p> <p>Covers the skills required by practitioners to establish and maintain effective communication with the client throughout all interactions and provide basic counselling as required and as appropriate to facilitate the treatment or health service being provided.</p>
HLTCOM502B	<p><b>Develop Professional Expertise</b></p> <p>Describes the skills and knowledge required to initiate and maintain continual development of professional skills and knowledge in complementary healthcare and contribute to the knowledge base of the specific healthcare practice.</p>
HLTCOM406B	<p><b>Make Referrals To Other Health Care Professional When Appropriate</b></p> <p>Describes the skills and knowledge required to arrange referrals to other health care professionals when required.</p>
CHCORG28A	<p><b>Reflect And Improve Upon Professional Practice</b></p> <p>Describes the knowledge and skills required evaluate own work, continuing self-development and effective supervision within an ethical code of practice.</p>
HLTSHU509B	<p><b>Maintain Personal Health And Awareness as a Professional Responsibility</b></p> <p>Covers the skills required for a health worker to maintain personal and professional health in order to effectively treat clients and to maintain professional integrity.</p>
HLTCOM503B	<p><b>Manage A Practice</b></p> <p>Describes the skills and knowledge required to manage a clinical health practice according to the size and scale of the business.</p>
HLTHIR506B	<p><b>Implement And Monitor Compliance With Legal And Ethical Requirements</b></p> <p>Describes the skills and knowledge required to implement and monitor compliance with legal and ethical requirements relevant in the work area.</p>
HLTOHS300A	<p><b>Contribute To OHS Processes</b></p> <p>Specifies the workplace performance required by an employee to contribute to OHS processes where there is responsibility for own work outputs and possibly limited responsibility for the work output of others.</p>

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HLTIN301A	<p><b>Comply With Infection Control Policies And Procedures In Health Work</b> Describes the skills and knowledge required for workers to comply with infection control policies and procedures. All procedures must be carried out in accordance with current infection control guidelines, Australian and New Zealand Standards for maintaining infection control and the policies and procedures of the organisation.</p>
HLTAP401A	<p><b>Confirm Physical Health Status</b> Describes a detailed level of knowledge of anatomy and physiology required to confirm physical health status.</p>
HLTAP501A	<p><b>Analyse Health Information</b> Describes the application of in-depth level of knowledge of anatomy and physiology required to analyse available health information in relation to specific services to be provided.</p>
HLTFA301B	<p><b>Apply First Aid</b> Describes the skills and knowledge required to provide first aid response, life support, management of casualty(s), the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.</p>

HLTNUT610A	<p><b>Provide Basic Dietary Advice</b> Describes the skills and knowledge required to provide basic advice on dietary modification according to established nutritional medicine principles and practice.</p>
CHCAC3C	<p><b>Orientation to Aged Care Work</b> Describes the roles and responsibilities by the worker in their role as a carer to perform work that reflects an understanding of the structure and profile of the residential aged care sector and key issues facing older people in the community.</p>
HLTRAH302A	<p><b>Undertake Home Visits</b> Describes the skills and knowledge required to make a home visit for the purpose of delivering health services.</p>
HLTCOM408B	<p><b>Use Specific Health Terminology To communicate Effectively</b> Covers the skills required to understand and respond to instructions, carry out routine tasks and communicate with a range of internal and external clients in a health care practice, using appropriate practice-specific health terminology.</p>

HLTREF504A	<b>Monitor And Evaluate Reflexology Treatments</b> Describes the skills and knowledge required to monitor and evaluate a range of Reflexology treatments provided as a part of a treatment plan for each client.
